REGULAR MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Hempfield Township Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday evening, July 5, 2022, at 7:00 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building.

All of the Supervisors were present. Richard G. Stanley of 8 Fox Creek Drive and Gregg Buchanan of 370 Wasser Bridge were also in attendance.

Chairman Gary Hittle called the Regular Meeting to order.

Chairman Hittle opened the meeting for Public Comment. Greg Buchanan of 370 Wasser Bridge Road had questions regarding the demolition of the mobile home trailer across from his property and the future use of the property on the southwest corner of Wasser Bridge and Hamburg Road.

Chairman Hittle said he would entertain a motion to dispense with the reading and approve of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 7, 2022. Supervisor Geisel made the motion, Supervisor Todd Hittle duly seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried. Chairman Hittle said the minutes are a public document and may be viewed at any time during regular business hours.

Chairman Hittle said that there are activities for the Hempfield Township Volunteer Fire Department which must be approved by the Supervisors at this time. They are: July 7-Training; July 9/10/23/24/28/30 Gun Raffle at Andover Drive Inn; July 11- Directors/Membership meeting; July 14- Training; July 16-Golf Outing Fundraiser; July 19- Mercer County Fire Chiefs Meeting; July 21-Training; July 28- Training; July 28- Family Picnic. Vice-Chairman Geisel made a motion to approve the activities mentioned. It was duly seconded by Supervisor Hittle and unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

Next on the Agenda is the viewing of reports of the various Township departments. The police report for the month of June was first presented. The men worked 721-man hours and traveled 4,830 miles. They issued 10 traffic citations. There were 6 accidents with 2 injuries. There were 60 criminal-related incidents, 406 service incidents, 29 police information, and 55 additional traffic related incidents. Property stolen was in the amount of \$49,408.40 with \$47,989.68 recovered. No property was damaged.

There were 2 zoning permits issued by the Zoning Administrator for the month of June. They were issued as follows: William Snyder of 308 Quailvue Road for an inground swimming pool at an estimated market value of \$50,000.00 and Delores Gersuch of 103 Hempfield Avenue for a storage shed at an estimated market value of \$4,356.00.

The Maintenance Report for June was reviewed next. Cut berms along St. Glory Road and Callahan Road; Repaired Guide Rail at bridge on St. Glory Road; Mowed banks at St. Glory Road and Gruber Road intersection; Trimmed trees on Templeton Avenue; Cut brush along Township Roads; Filled washout on road edge near mailbox on Wasser Road; Patched Salem Road for summer maintenance; Cleaned up and repaired hydraulic hose on Bucket Truck; Replaced wheels on bench grinder; Mowed at park; Mowed and cleaned ditches at

Hempfield Apartments; Serviced HTPD Unit#3; Sprayed weeds at Township Building; Met with representative from Plyler Entry Doors regarding man door replacements at the Township Building; Set up park for pavilion rentals; Changed mower blades on zero turn mower; Trimmed ditches around Township; Moved wood chips to park for mulching around trees; Cleaned park after weekend rentals; Cleaned pavilions at park; Washed HTPD vehicles numerous times; Spread fins on township roads due to tar bleed in limited spots; Patched township roads; Put in new driveway culvert on Webster Drive; Mowed road side berms along township roads; Worked on restoring function of Traffic Signals at Hadley Road and Williamson Road with contractor Bruce & Merrilees due to lightning strike; Checked roads after 6/26 storms; Jetted and un plugged main sewer line along Hadley Road; Replaced hydraulic hose on main pump on Jetter; Marked PA One Calls; Cut grass at park and removed weeds; Ditching in Frontier Estates along Cedar Drive; Cleaned up barn at Park.

Last, The Fire Department had 16 total calls during June, 2 EMS and 14 for Fire. Mutual Aid was given 3 times and received once.

Chairman Hittle opened the miscellaneous portion of the meeting. There were no comments.

Chairman Hittle said he would make a motion that checks be issued in payment of all utility bills, and that all other bills be checked and upon approval, be paid. Supervisor Geisel made that motion, Supervisor Hittle duly seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

There being no further business, Supervisor Hittle made a motion to adjourn. The motion to adjourn was duly seconded by Supervisor Geisel, and unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

Chairman Hittle declared the Meeting adjourned.
